

Safety Meeting Minutes  
April 14, 2021

The following individuals participated in the April 14<sup>th</sup> zoom meeting:

Mrs. Reitz reviewed with the committee that 2-way radios, barricades and GoKits have been ordered via the ACT 147 Grant.

Mrs. Reitz informed the committee that a list for chemical disposal needs went out to all department heads by Christine Mostoller and no one had anything to dispose of. Dee compiled a list of items here in the Operations Facility that needs discarded. The list was sent to the LIU for the awarded disposal bidder. The disposal will be scheduled some time in June or early July.

Mr. Meiser addressed the committee regarding the current safety and security funding we received and that all the cameras in the district have either been replaced or upgraded, with the exception of the HS because there's are fairly new. KIT conducted a training to administrators and supervisors and everyone has the ability now to view cameras should an incident occur.

Mr. Meiser noted the secure vestibule projects are underway at both the Middle School and the Reid Elementary School.

Mr. Meiser shared the Union Street Bridge project is taking place and that there will be a temporary 2 lane bridge installed to keep traffic flowing. This project is scheduled to take approximately 1 to 1-1/2 years to complete.

Mr Meiser said the stadium project is going well with no safety issues thus far. Everything is moving along as planned.

Mr. Meiser confirmed that the Covid-19 funds have been received. The Operations main focus is on air quality so we are trying to stay ahead of the game by ordering filters for the next quarter as soon as the current orders are received. Principals will need to review and discuss their needs/concerns with Dr. Suski.

Mr. Franklin informed the committee members that we have been with our workman's comp carrier for the past 3 years and during that time we've submitted 36 claims. The total cost has come to \$63,000. In reviewing the claims, he shared that our biggest issues have been slips, trips and falls. He wants to ensure that we are doing our part to prevent these accidents from happening, so our numbers decrease.
