


IN THE SCIENCE LAB








MUSIC MAKERS



RECEIVE A CALL, TEXT AND EMAIL BY SETTING UP SCHOOLMESSENGER IN YOUR PARENT PORTAL



While you're there, be sure you have completed your FORMS section.



Be sure to complete both of those steps FOR EACH STUDENT.

WHY AM I NOT RECEIVING SCHOOL NOTIFICATIONS?

There are several possible reasons why you aren't receiving our communications:

- 1. Your SchoolMessenger section in your PowerSchool Parent Portal has not been completed (see red arrows above).
- 2. There is an error in the information you entered in SchoolMessenger such as a mistyped email or phone number.
- 3. You did not select all three types of notifications: call, text, and email.
- Your contact information changed and you updated it in PowerSchool, but you did NOT update it in SchoolMessenger.
- 5. Our emails are going to your junk folder. You will need to mark our emails "not junk."
- 6. Someone at your account clicked "unsubscribe" at the bottom of one of our emails so your email address is now on our "Blocked List."

If you have addressed all of the above issues and still aren't receiving our messages, please contact <u>communications@raiderweb.org</u> for assistance.

WHAT IF I HAVE A CHANGE IN MY PHONE/EMAIL/ADDRESS/CUSTODY INFORMATION?

- All contact and demographic information such as phone numbers, email addresses
 and mailing address, can be updated directly in your PowerSchool Parent Portal.
 Remember to also update the SchoolMessenger section so our notifications reach
 you. You no longer need to contact your school office to provide this information.
- If you move to a new address in the District, enter it in the Portal and you will be instructed to upload a primary proof of residency.
- If you have a new custody order, please submit a copy to your school office.

NURSE NOTES

- Dental exams will be held soon for:
 - Any 7th grader who did not turn in a private form OR
 - Any new 7th grade students OR
 - Any students who did not receive an exam in 7th grade.
- Physical exams will be held November 14 & 21, 2023 for:

 - Any new 6th grade students OR
 - Any students who did not receive a physical in 6th grade.

- Any student needing medication throughout the day must have a Doctor's order on file. Parents must bring the medication into school.

STUDENT APPOINTMENTS DURING THE SCHOOL DAY

To increase the safety and security for our students, we are no longer able to dismiss students during the school day without a parent or guardian signing them out from the Main Office. Moving forward, parents or guardians will need to alert the MAMS Office Staff to a student's early dismissal in writing or by calling into the office. We will call the student out of class and have them ready for their dismissal. Only authorized people will be able to pick up a student from school. The person picking up the student will need to come to the Main Office, show their valid ID card, and sign the student out from school.

We appreciate your attention to this matter. We also know that this is creating an extra step, but it is crucial that we follow these new procedures when dismissing students early from school. Thank you for your cooperation.

ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL

The school day begins at 7:40 a.m. and ends at 2:40 p.m. Students who are riding the bus to school should use the main entrance by the office. Students who are being dropped off should arrive by 7:40 a.m. and use the back entrance by the radio station. Those who arrive after 7:40 a.m. need to be dropped off at the front entrance.

Car riders will be dismissed at 2:40 p.m. and should report to the back entrance to wait for their ride. Bus riders should stay in their homerooms until their bus number is announced. Students who are not involved in an after-school activity are to go home and not linger around the building. No pupil is permitted to leave the building at any time during school hours without receiving permission from the office. Early dismissal students must sign out at the office when leaving and sign in when they return.

Anyone picking up students at dismissal time should remain in the car pick-up line. While we understand the line may be long and a bit slow, we need to maintain a safe, orderly pick-up procedure to ensure student safety. We kindly ask that you do not park your car and have your student(s) crossing traffic to meet you. Students being picked up should remain on the sidewalk by the radio tower until their ride pulls up to the curb. We thank you in advance for your time and consideration to this matter. As always, our main goal at MAMS is student safety.

If a student misses the bus at the end of the day, the District does not provide extra transportation. A parent/guardian must pick up the student by 3:30pm.

If you have a change in your student's routine bus transportation, there is a required 72 hour notice.

EDUCATIONAL TRIPS

The District may excuse eligible students from school attendance to participate in non-school sponsored educational trips at the expense of the parents/guardians, in accordance with the following:

- A written request utilizing the "Educational Trip Request Form" shall be made by the student's parent/guardian five (5) days prior to the trip.
- If more than one (1) child in a family is taking the trip, the request for all the children must be included in the request made to the building Principal of the oldest child. That Principal will coordinate the review of the request with the appropriate Principals.
- The student must have a regular pattern of attendance and shall be in good academic standing with the District.
- Educational trips may be permitted each school year and are limited to a maximum of five (5) school days.
- The District recognizes the importance of final examinations as a review of the year's learning. Therefore, if a final exam shall be scheduled, educational trips shall not be approved during the final two (2) weeks of the school term.
- Educational trips shall not be approved during the days of scheduled assessment testing such as Keystone Exams, course mid-terms/finals, and other assessments such as PSAT and ASVAB.
- Students shall be responsible for all classroom work that shall be missed and shall be responsible for communication with assigned teachers prior to the approved educational trip, in order to schedule applicable make-up assignments.

Students not complying with this Policy will be subject to unexcused or illegal days of absence and will forfeit make-up privileges. Educational trip days are considered an absence from school. Violations of policy may result in disciplinary action in accordance with Board policy.
